Louisiana Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers (LACDL) hosts its Annual Justice Albert Tate, Jr. Awards Banquet Virtually

Baton Rouge, La. (December 11, 2020) - The Louisiana Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers (LACDL) hosted the 35th Annual Justice Albert Tate, Jr. Awards Banquet on Friday, December 11, 2020. This event was held a little differently than normal, as it was all done virtually through Zoom videoconference. LACDL recognized individuals who are champions in criminal defense law and hosted the virtual Justice Albert Tate, Jr. Awards Ceremony to honor these individuals from a safely, instead of celebrating in-person.

Rob McDuff was awarded the Justice Albert Tate Jr. Award. This award is named in honor of the late Justice Albert Tate, Jr., who served on the U.S. Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals and the Louisiana State Supreme Court. The award is presented for outstanding contributions to the Louisiana system of criminal justice and is dedicated to constitutional principles. The award is designed to honor individuals for dedication to, or in defense of, those constitutional principles for which Justice Tate stood. This is LACDL's most prestigious award.

Chief Justice Bernette Joshua Johnson was awarded the Chief Justice Pascal F. Calogero Jr. Lifetime Achievement Award. This award is named for recognition of outstanding work on behalf of Criminal Justice in an official position. It honors Judges, legislatures and others.

Steve Singer was awarded the Sam Dalton Capital Defense Award because of their dedication to Capital Defense Advocacy in Louisiana. This person has spent their career advocating for Criminal Justice and is known and respected by those in the Criminal Defense Profession.

Alaina Boothe was the recipient of a new award for 2020. The Equity & Justice Award, which is given to individuals or a collective, who's work over the course of their career has been to break down barriers of racism & create equity in the criminal justice system.

Jane Hogan was awarded the Professor Lucy McGough Juvenile Justice Award for her involvement with juvenile justice issues that affect our justice systems daily. Juvenile justice has been elevated to its rightful place as an equal part of the criminal justice system by the hard work and dedication of someone like Rachel.

Jim Boren, Richard Schroeder, & Walt Sanchez were awarded the LACDL President's Appreciation Award. This award was created to honor an individual or a group of individuals that the president felt displayed devotion and service to the justice system, setting an example for others to follow.

Michael Gregory was awarded the Trustees of Freedom Gideon Award. This award is in recognition of outstanding contributions to the Right to Counsel, including Legislative work, work "in the trenches", and a concern for clients and Criminal Justice in the last year or more.

Gary Clements was awarded the Trustees of Freedom Lifetime Service Award. This award is in recognition of outstanding accomplishments over a lifetime of service on behalf of the law.
